- Reserve your place for fall 2022 by accepting your offer of admission no later than **May 1**. **Log in to your SDSU WebPortal account at sdsu.edu/portal and submit your online Intent to Enroll form and \$400 nonrefundable deposit.**
- Send transcript(s) from all high schools and colleges you have attended, including fall 2021 grades, and all official test scores for SAT, ACT, Advanced Placement (AP), and International Baccalaureate (IB) tests you have taken (if applicable). Please check your SDSU WebPortal account for a list of required documents.
- Submit your Student Housing License Agreement and a **nonrefundable** fee of \$375 by **May 1** if you are required, or have chosen, to live in on-campus housing. If applicable, apply for on-campus housing on the Housing Portal and submit and e-sign your completed license agreement. More information will be available on housing.sdsu.edu/resources/apply.
- Plan to attend [Explore SDSU Open House](#) on **March 12** (virtually) and **April 9** (in person) and [New Student Orientation](#) in summer 2022. All new students are **expected** to complete New Student Orientation. More information about these important events is available at sdsu.edu/internationalfirstyearadmits.
- In addition, review the International Admissions website at sdsu.edu/internationalfirstyearadmits for important information about the Steps to Enroll, tuition and fees, course registration, preparing for your arrival and New International Student Orientation.

Please note that your admission is conditional on completing, with C- or higher grades, all coursework in progress AND maintaining your reported overall grade point average.

SDSU sends important email communications throughout the admission process. As an admitted student, you will receive an email with instructions explaining how to activate your SDSUid account,

which will be used to log in to multiple systems at SDSU for business and academic purposes. Complete the steps listed in the email to activate your account. After you complete your Intent to Enroll, you will receive information about your official SDSU Gmail email address. **Future official communication from the university will be delivered to your official SDSU Gmail address after your Intent to Enroll is submitted.** More information is available at sdsuid.sdsu.edu.
