## **IMPORTANT INFORMATION: PLEASE READ CAREFULLY**

**Final Grades and Prerequisite/Transfer Credit Review:** Please review your offer letter carefully for any conditions that may be necessary to keep your offer and transfer credit (if applicable). If you are currently in studies, we will check your final results to ensure you meet the final average requirement and have completed all prerequisite subjects. If you are admitted for Fall (September) and are currently registered in an online course, or you find it necessary to take a summer school course to meet a condition of your offer, you must provide a final grade no later than AUGUST 19, 2022. **This is a firm deadline so please plan accordingly since failure to meet the conditions of any offer may result in your offer being revoked or your program changed, and if applicable transfer credit rescinded.** If you have been admitted for Winter 2022 (January), you must submit all final grades no later than December 1, 2021.

**Official Documents:** If you accept an offer of admission based on unofficial documents, you will be required to have official final academic documents/transcripts sent from each secondary school, college, university or proper issuing authority directly to Brock University, Undergraduate Admissions. These documents may never be in your possession and cannot be uploaded using your applicant portal. All official documents must be submitted in order to begin studies. Electronic documents directly from the issuing institution are acceptable and can be emailed to [admissions@brocku.ca](mailto:admissions@brocku.ca).

**Alternate Offers:** Alternate offers are extended when one or more admission requirements are not met for entry to a preferred program. Upon submission of final grades, and subject to space availability, you may be eligible for a revised offer to your preferred program.

**Accepting Your Offer:** Accept via [www.ouac.on.ca](http://www.ouac.on.ca) no later than the date indicated in your offer of admission letter. If this is a revised offer, your previous offer is no longer valid, as you can only hold one offer of admission at a time.

**Paying Your Tuition Deposit:** Your offer letter will indicate if you are required to submit a tuition deposit. Learn how to submit your tuition deposit here: [brocku.ca/safa](http://brocku.ca/safa)

**Applying for a Study Permit:** Your offer letter will indicate if you are required to apply for a Study Permit (VISA). Learn more here: [brocku.ca/international](http://brocku.ca/international). Deferral options are available, should a delay in study permit processing occur.

**Applying for Residence:** Brock must receive both your residence application and fee prior to June 1, 2022. Brock University does not accept credit card payments, so be sure to allow time for your payment to be received prior to June 1. Visit [brocku.ca/residence](http://brocku.ca/residence) to learn how to apply and pay for residence.

**Registering For Classes:** For September entry, course registration begins in July for new Year 1 students with no transfer credit. If you are transferring from a college or university, your registration date is determined by your number of transfer credits. Closer to June you will be asked to start preparing your schedule in anticipation of registering in classes. Watch for emailed notices!

**Paying Your Fees:** Brock does not mail paper statements. Beginning mid-July, it is your responsibility to check your fee statement via your student portal at [my.brocku.ca](http://my.brocku.ca). Spring and Winter admits should check after registering in classes. You will see tuition owing for registered courses and any residence or meal plan fees, if applicable.

**Transfer Credit and Academic Advising:** If you were awarded transfer credit, you may need help understanding how your credit can be applied toward your degree. For help booking your appointment, visit: [brocku.ca/academic-advising](http://brocku.ca/academic-advising)

It is important to note that you must accept your offer, and submit your tuition deposit, in order to register in classes. The tuition deposit is **non-refundable**; as such, please ask any questions you may have prior to paying your tuition deposit. Here are some important steps that you must complete:

(1) Go to [ouac.on.ca](http://ouac.on.ca) and electronically accept your Offer of Admission no later than the date specified in your Offer of Admission letter. You will need your OUAC reference number to accept on line.

(2) Submit a \$1000.00 Cdn non-refundable tuition deposit no later than the acceptance date in your offer of admission letter. Use one of the following payment methods:

If making your payment from outside Canada, you must use Western Union Bank to Bank Transfer or CIBC International Student Payment Service. For details, refer to [brocku.ca/safa/tuition-and-fees/making-a-payment](http://brocku.ca/safa/tuition-and-fees/making-a-payment).

If you are currently residing in Canada and have a Canadian bank account, you may pay via internet, telephone or ATM banking, in person at a Canadian bank, or by cheque. Please see [brocku.ca/safa/tuition-and-fees/making-a-payment](http://brocku.ca/safa/tuition-and-fees/making-a-payment) for details. Note: Brock University does not accept credit card payments for deposits or tuition payment.

You must ensure that your full name, OUAC reference number (if applicable) and Brock ID number are included with the submission of the tuition deposit.

The tuition deposit is non-refundable except in cases where a Study Permit (Visa) is denied. For this reason, it is strongly recommended that you check with the closest Canadian Embassy, Consulate or High Commission to confirm time-lines for receiving a Study Permit BEFORE submitting your deposit. With proof of denial in the form of an official letter from the Canadian Embassy, Consulate or High Commission submitted no later than September 10, 2022, the tuition deposit may be refunded (minus a \$100.00 administration fee).

We recommend you keep a photocopy or electronic copy of your payment.

A receipt for the non-refundable tuition deposit can be ordered within the forms area of the student self serve in your [my.brocku.ca](http://my.brocku.ca) portal.

Brock Central will issue a receipt upon payment of the tuition deposit (if paid in person). If paying on-line or by transfer, proof of payment may be verified through the 'Student Financial History' link in your [my.brocku.ca](http://my.brocku.ca) portal.

This is NOT a residence deposit and cannot be used to hold a space in residence.

## Brock Scholars Award - Eligibility Requirements

### Determining the value of your Brock Scholars Award:

The Brock Scholars Award is offered on the basis of your admission average. The minimum average to be eligible for this program is 80.0%. Brock calculates your admission average to the nearest 10th of a percent. We do not round averages up or down. \*The award value is subject to approval by the Board of Trustees and is only applicable for the Offer of Admission enclosed.

80.0 - 84.9%	\$4,000*	(\$1,000 first year, \$1,000 renewable x maximum of 3)
85.0 - 89.9%	\$6,000*	(\$1,500 first year, \$1,500 renewable x maximum of 3)
90.0 - 92.9%	\$10,000*	(\$2,500 first year, \$2,500 renewable x maximum of 3)
93.0 - 100.0%	\$16,000*	(\$4,000 first year, \$4,000 renewable x maximum of 3)

The final value of your award may increase or decrease if your FINAL admission average changes. To remain eligible for the scholarship amount you have been offered, you must achieve the minimum FINAL admission average for that scholarship range. If there is any change in the amount you are to receive, you will be notified as to the final amount of your scholarship. If your final admission average is less than 80.0%\*\* you will no longer be eligible for a Brock Scholars award. \*\*U.S. applicants please refer to [brocku.ca/admissions/international/united-states-curriculum/](http://brocku.ca/admissions/international/united-states-curriculum/) for clarification.

### Final Admission Average:

In Ontario, a student's final admission average is determined using the top 6 grade 12U or 12M credits (including prerequisites). If you complete a non-Ontario curriculum, the final admission average criteria will vary by curriculum, and will be determined by the Admissions Office. Courses taken in the summer following graduation will be considered for scholarship revisions, but official transcripts will only be accepted until October 31.

### Scholarship Disbursement:

Your scholarship will be applied directly to your tuition and/or residence fees. This will take place before classes begin, reducing the amount you owe to the University. If you are commencing full time studies in the Spring or Winter sessions, you will receive one half of your full scholarship value before classes begin. The remainder of your scholarship will be credited to your student account before classes begin in the subsequent session.

### Brock Course Load Requirements:

To receive the first installment of your scholarship, you must be a full-time student. If you reduce your course load to part-time status (less than 3.0 credits in the fall/winter) or withdraw from the University, the value of your scholarship will be pro-rated or withdrawn. Please advise the Student Accounts and Financial Aid Office of any change in your registration status - preferably before a change is actually made in order to assess the financial implications.

### Scholarship Renewal:

Renewals will be based upon completion of each 5.0 credit milestone. An 80.0% average is required to renew. Renewal eligibility is assessed upon completion of each 5.0 credit milestone, regardless of whether or not the scholarship was renewed the previous year.

Students pursuing a pass degree (3 years of study) are eligible for a total of 2 consecutive renewals; students pursuing an honours degree (4 years of study) are eligible for a total of 3 consecutive renewals.

Students pursuing the Concurrent Education program are only eligible for scholarship renewals during the completion of their first undergraduate degree and will not receive a scholarship renewal in their final two years of Teachers Education.

For courses completed while on exchange, or any course that does not have a numeric value (eg. nursing clinical or Co-op work terms) students must contact [central@brocku.ca](mailto:central@brocku.ca) for renewal review. Co-op work term courses are excluded from renewal milestones. Other credit courses that do not have a numeric grade are used to determine the renewal milestones but do not affect the milestone academic average. Renewal averages are calculated using courses that have numeric grades within the milestone. If there are no numeric grades in the milestone, the grades from the previous milestone will be used.

### Scholarship Acceptance:

To confirm your scholarship acceptance and receive your scholarship you must reply to your Offer of Admission by the deadline indicated. Recipients agree to permit the release of their name, program, and year of study.

**OSAP Implications:** Please Note: If you are intending to apply for OSAP, **DO NOT** list this scholarship under "Award Income" in your OSAP application. We will report this and all other Brock-funded awards on your behalf.
